From the Co-Pastors...

On Sunday, March 6, we will remember the Transfiguration of our Lord with three services of Worship, beginning at 8:30, 9:45, and 11:00 am.

A few days later, we will enter the season of Lent. Beginning with an observance of Ash Wednesday on March 9, from 7:00-7:30 PM, we will start our 40 day journey (excluding Sundays) toward Easter (April 24). Sundays, even in the season of Lent, are always considered joyful celebrations of Christ's resurrection. The Lenten season provides the Church an opportunity to somberly reflect and repent. It is a time for renewing our commitment to Christ and seeking God's will for our lives (individually and collectively). As we remember the story of our Lord resisting temptations, conversing with Nicodemus about being reborn, offering living water to a Samaritan woman, healing a man blind from birth, raising Lazarus from the dead, triumphantly entering Jerusalem on a humble donkey, suffering through mistreatment by religious and civil authorities, dying on a cross between two thieves, and being miraculously restored to life on the third day, we find our devotion deepened and our hope heightened. The word "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten," which means "spring." As we watch God bring new life to nature, we are invited to open ourselves to the work of the Holy Spirit who brings to fulfillment the promise of our Savior, "Behold, I make all things new!"

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to observe a holy Lent:
by self-examination and repentance;
by prayer, fasting, and self-denial;
and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.
(From the Ash Wednesday liturgy, *UMC Book of Worship*, p. 322)

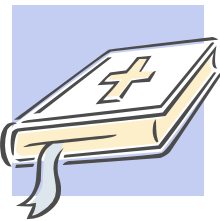

We need the following assistance for students from Kent State University Men's Chorus:

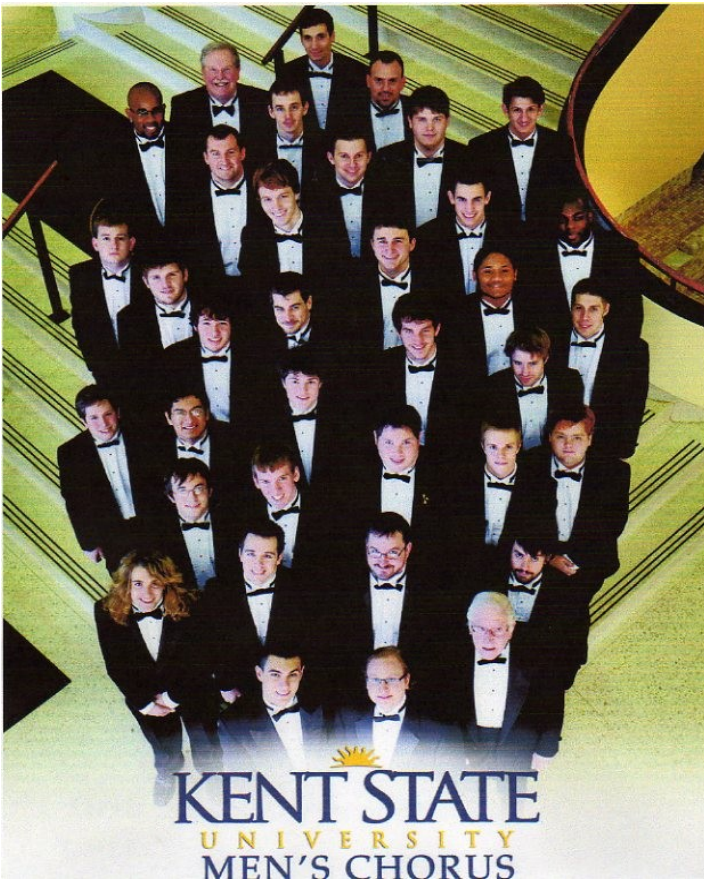
- Housing for pairs of students on Saturday Night, March 26.

PENNIES FOR HUNGER

Ezekiel 7:19. " They will throw their silver into the streets, and their gold will be an unclean thing. Their silver and gold will not be able to save them in the day of the Lord's wrath. It will not satisfy their hunger or fill their stomachs with it, for it has made them stumble into sin. " God's people had allowed their love of money to lead them into sin. And for this God would destroy them. Money has a strange power to lead people into sin. Paul said that "the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil" (1st Timothy 6:10). It is ironic that we use money - a gift of God - to buy things that separate us from Him. It is tragic that we spend so much money seeking to satisfy ourselves and so little time seeking God, the true source of satisfaction.
