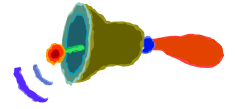

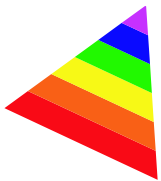

WHAT IS LENT?

There are six seasons in the Church calendar: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. This year Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, and ends on Easter Sunday, April 8th. There are forty days in Lent, as the seven Sundays are not counted. Lent is a time to prepare our hearts for Easter. We do this by prayer, using the Bible and other readings for reflection, and repentance. Many Christians also deprive themselves of something and also devote themselves to God with a new task during Lent. This year during Lent, we at Wesleyan Chapel will strive to observe Lent together and individually.

On Shrove Tuesday, February 21st, at 6:00 pm, you are invited to participate in a pancake dinner. In many countries in Europe, Shrove Tuesday is called Pancake Day and is considered the last Feast day before Lent. The idea was to use up all of the rich ingredients in the cupboard before Lent. This will be a fun family time for everyone. We will have hot pancakes until 7:00 and then have a few pancake races (details at the dinner).

We want to combine the aspect of denial in Lent with the One Great Hour of Sharing offering that is taken by the church each year for UMCOR. We are asking each person or family to think of something to deny themselves during Lent. Examples are: only getting water with your meals or giving up sweets. Then put a price on your denial and save that money during Lent. On Easter Sunday you can bring in your collected money or write a check for the amount. The money collected will be for One Great Hour of Sharing. We would like to encourage you to take up a new task that helps you be more devoted to God. Examples are: more prayer time, write one letter or card each day to a home bound person, rake your elderly neighbors' leaves. We will have available for you a weekly meditation book, suggested Bible readings, and a Holy Week devotional.



My hope and prayer is that these Lenten activities in combination with other planned activities during February and March will lead you to a spiritual renewal and help prepare you for the celebration of Easter.

Much of the success is attributed the faithful few that worshipped in the small Chapel prior to 1985. These dedicated faithful members passed on the friendly, loving, and welcoming values to those of us that make up today's congregation, and we continue to pass it on. Speak to any new member and they will tell you that they became members of Wesleyan Chapel because of this Love and Fellowship that we share.

Over the weeks leading up to Lent, someone will speak each Sunday and witness about their Love for Christ and how they serve him at Wesleyan Chapel.
